The Impact of Your Gifts Divided by the Sea



During the greatest migration crisis in Europe since World War II, UNC's Vimy Global Team traveled to Reggio Calabria in southern Italy to document the complex struggles of both the migrants arriving on boats and the local population's response.

“We spent four weeks filming, interviewing migrants and locals, gathering their stories. This opportunity gave us the chance to gain a deeper understanding and an intimate look at the crisis,” said Vimy Team member Gabriela Arp '16 M.A.

Since their return, Team member William Moose '16 M.C.R.P. has delved into creating interactive visualizations of the migration crisis. The Team has collaborated with assistant professor Steven King and undergraduate students Clinton King '17 and Andrea Roberson '16 in the School of Media and Journalism to develop an educational website to host the multimedia stories and visualizations. Inspired by UNC alumnus Peter McMillan '81, the Vimy Global Team Award is given annually to an interdisciplinary team of students to pursue a research or service project. Funding comes from private gifts to the Chancellor's Global Education Fund.

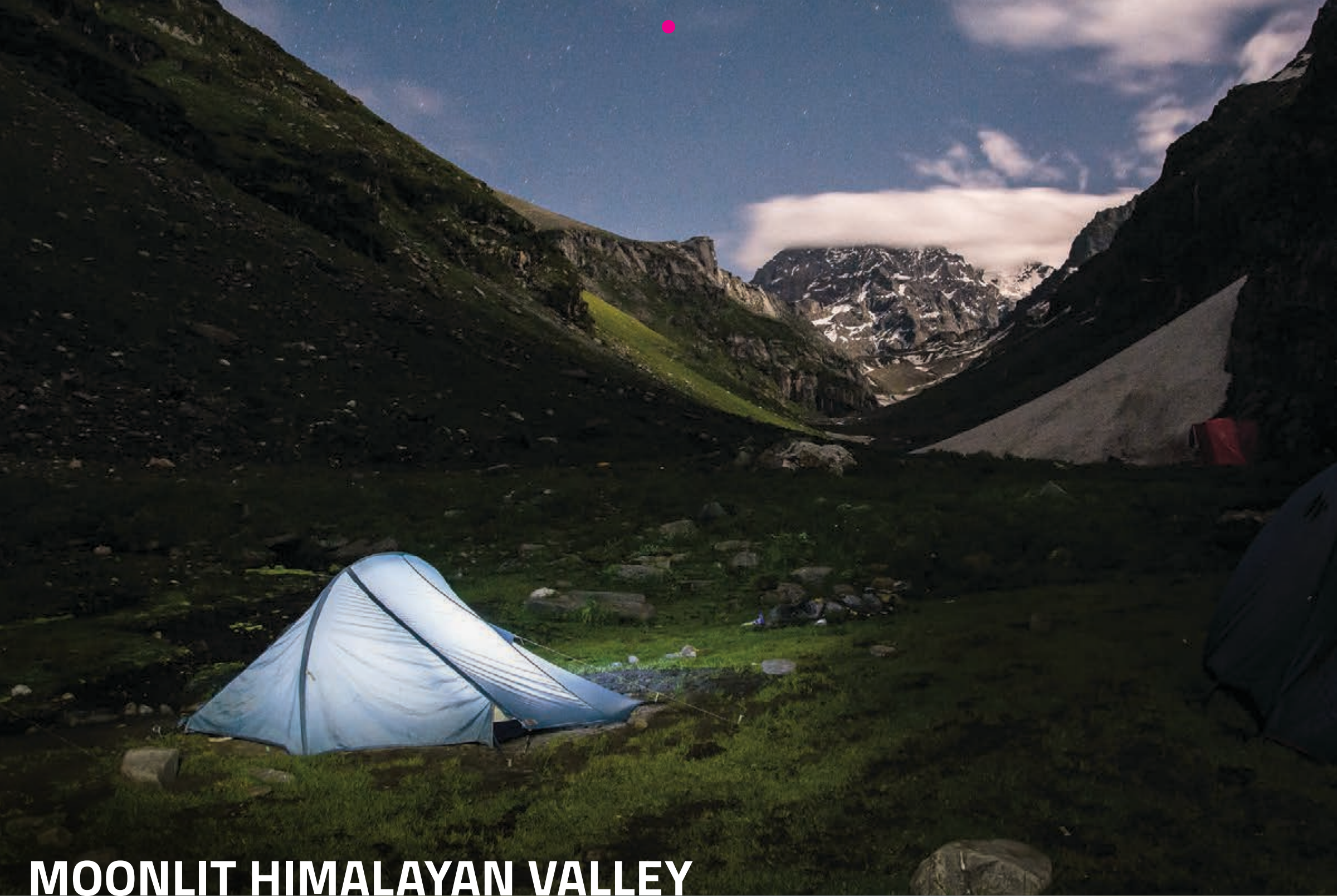

LAUNCHING SPRING 2016

Embark Carolina is a new, dynamic resource in the university's effort to open access to global opportunities so that more diverse students can pursue more diverse experiences. Its two main features help students explore every region of the world, regardless of their background, discipline or perspective:

- 1) GLOBAL GUIDE is a student-focused how-to manual on the steps to take to find a global opportunity that fits specific needs, interests and concerns.
- 2) GLOBAL SEARCH helps students identify awards, scholarships and fellowships to support them in pursuing a global opportunity.

GLOBAL TAKE OFF: PUERTO RICO

Global Take Off: Puerto Rico provides full funding for students to participate in an interactive, four-day, faculty-led trip to Puerto Rico over Fall Break. The program is a collaboration of the Center for Global Initiatives, the Institute for the Study of the Americas and the Sonja Haynes Stone Center for Black Culture and History, and it targets first year and new transfer students who have limited or no global travel experience and who have demonstrated financial need. The program, funded through 2019, is made possible by a generous donation from alumna Maribel Carrion '77, '86 M.B.A., in memory of her sister, Marisela, who was also an alumna.

PASSPORT TO GO!

Passport to GO! provides the first passport to first-year and new transfer students with high financial need. With funding from the Global Education Fund, the Center for Global Initiatives launched this program in 2012 providing 15 students with their first passport. Since then, with continued support from the Global Education Fund and a seed grant from UNC's Parent Council, the program has expanded to serve almost 200 students.

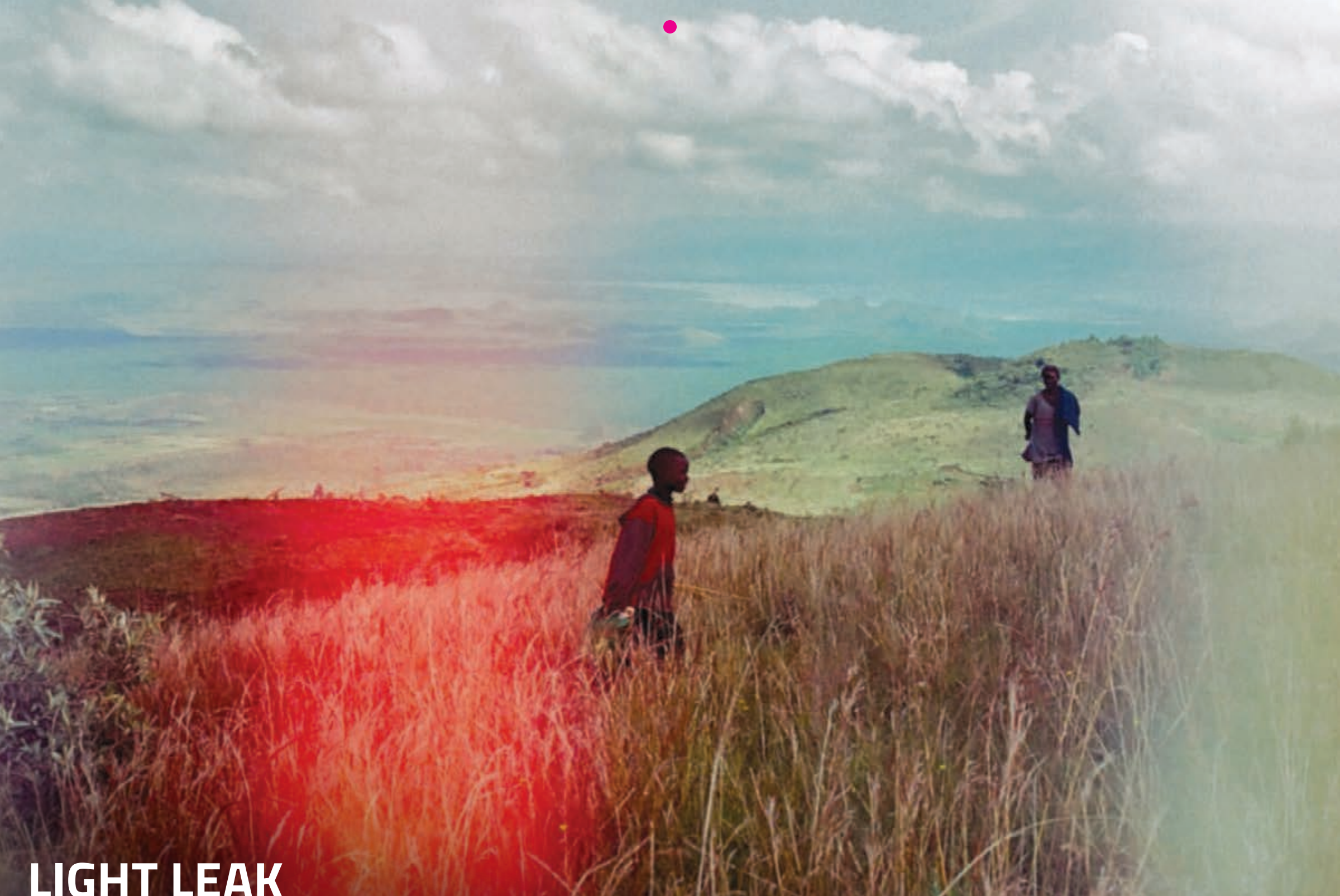

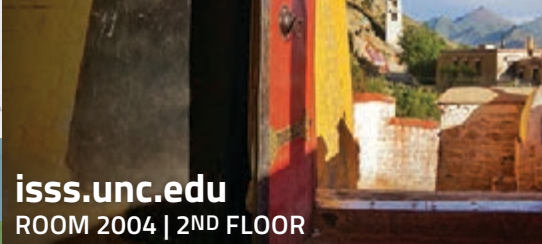
