German-Language Recitation Section for Hist/Euro 159:

Twentieth
Century
Europe

This course provides a critical overview of 20th-century European history, paying particular attention to ethnic, religious, social, economic, and cultural struggles in various sub-units of the old continent. Topics include the 1st and 2nd World Wars, the Holocaust, the rise of and organization of the Nazi party in Germany, the Russian Revolution, the rise of Italian Fascism, the Cold War, the organization of Europe throughout the century, the collapse of former Yugoslavia, and related topics such as Modernism and post-war popular culture. In the process, the German experience is contextualized in a broader European framework.

The lecture may be supplemented by an optional LAC recitation conducted entirely in German, accompanied by readings in the German language about German colonialism, the declaration of the Weimar Republic, the burning of the Reichstag, Kristallnacht, the building of the Berlin Wall, and the Reunification. Literary texts will also play a major role.
