

We also want every Carolina student to arrive on campus with a passport waiting in their dorm room. About 1,000 students arrived in August 2017 without a U.S. passport, and therefore are unable to explore the world. Let's remove that barrier!

Lastly, to help students find global experiences, they need to hear from other students. That's why we are building the **Experience Explorer**, a searchable database where student's who've had a global opportunity can share their experience with others.

CGI's Opening Access work has helped bring attention to the barriers that many students face, and now the entire campus is committing itself to the Global Guarantee. Whether it's a formal global studies major or a suite of experiences like study abroad, U.S. immersion trips, and culturally based conferences and performances, every undergraduate will be assured of a global experience.

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
